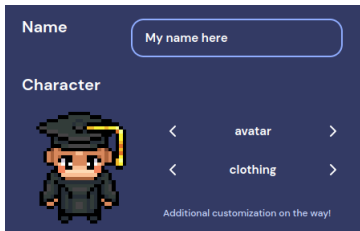

Quick connection procedure:

- ▶ Connect to link (<https://gather.town/app/wzBzKFufQYFVF1Ui/EUROPT2021>)
+ Enter password (**EUROPT2021**)
- ▶ You will be asked for your name, please use full name
- ▶ Choose an avatar
- ▶ To move around the room, use the arrow keys
- ▶ To interact with an item (eg. a whiteboard) you press 'x'
- ▶ When close to another avatar, you will see and hear the other person
- ▶ In one of the private spaces, only the others in that space can see and hear you
